




MARKET OVERVIEW

- According to the PMG-MAN, Nigeria is responsible for producing 60% of pharmaceutical drugs for the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS). The ECOWAS countries have an estimated population of nearly 300 million and a market size of US\$3.5 billion for health products
- Nigeria's pharmaceutical industry is expected to grow rapidly until 2020, reaching a total of US\$11 billion in pharmaceutical sales while Africa's pharmaceutical industry is expected to grow at a faster rate until 2020
- The total annual revenue of the top 20 Nigerian pharmaceutical manufacturers is estimated at US\$505 million
- Drugs on Nigeria's import prohibition list include: Paracetamol, Cotrimoxazole, Metronidazole, Chloroquine, Haematinic Formulations, Ferrous Sulphate and Ferrous Gluconate, Folic Acid, Vitamin B Complex, Multivitamin Tablets, Aspirin, Magnesium trisilicate, Piperazine, Levamisole, Clotrimazole cream, ointments – Penicillin/Gentamycin, Pyrantel Pamoate, and intravenous fluids

Why Nigeria?

Nigeria is now Africa's largest economy with a GDP of over US\$510 billion in 2014. This is expected to increase to more than US\$900 billion by 2019 making it more than twice the size of South Africa's GDP. It is also the most populous country in the world behind China and India, with its population expected to expand to 239 million in 2025 and 440 million in 2050.

The African pharmaceutical market is anticipated to achieve a year-on-year growth rate of 10.6% by 2020, resulting in pharmaceutical sales of US\$45 billion in 2020. Business Monitor International (BMI) put the size of Nigeria's pharmaceutical market at US\$600 million.

In 2014, three Nigerian pharmaceutical manufacturers were given the World Health Organization (WHO) pre-qualification approval to supply drugs globally. A further seven manufacturers are expected to be given the pre-approval by 2015, putting Nigeria among the nations of the world whose local drug industries manufacture at WHO standards.

This combined with the technical skills, trained manpower and basic manufacturing infrastructure already well established in the country; Nigeria is fast becoming the leading manufacturer and distributor of pharmaceutical drugs in sub-Saharan Africa.
